

THE GOLDEN PEGLEG




Roald Hoffmann, PhD '55 won the 1981 Nobel Prize in Chemistry for his work with Robert B. Woodward to develop the Woodward-Hoffmann rules, regarded as one of the most important conceptual advancement in theoretical organic chemistry in the last century. The rules gave chemists a powerful tool for predicting the pathways that chemical reactions may follow. In 1990, he also received the Priestley Medal of the American Chemical Society, chemistry's highest honor.

Dr. Hoffmann was born in 1937 in Złoczów, Poland and survived through a Nazi-occupied Poland by hiding in the attic of a Ukrainian schoolhouse. Decades later, he wrote a semi-autobiographical play, "Something that Belongs to You," based on his experiences from that time. Dr. Hoffmann entered Stuyvesant in 1951, two years after he and his family emigrated to America from Poland. He received an AB from Columbia University and completed his Masters and PhD in Chemistry at Harvard University.

Since 1965, Dr. Hoffmann has taught chemistry at Cornell and became the Frank H.T. Rhodes Professor of Human Letters in 1996. In addition to the 650+ scientific articles attached to his name, Dr. Hoffmann has also published seven collections of poetry, three plays, and five books of nonfiction.

OUTSTANDING PEGLEG IN GOVERNMENT SERVICE



Grace Meng, JD '93 represents New York's 6th Congressional District located in Queens, New York. As a daughter of immigrants growing up in Queens, the most diverse county in America, Grace quickly came to believe that every person deserves a seat at the table. That conviction prompted Grace to begin her professional career as a public interest lawyer before serving two terms in the New York State Assembly.

Now, in her third term in Congress, Grace continues to advocate for inclusive policies that benefit the vulnerable and the often overlooked. From her seat on the House Appropriations Committee, she regularly fights for federal programs that benefit women and children. She even co-founded the Bipartisan Congressional Kids' Safety Caucus which she still co-chairs.

While Grace remains one of the 15 youngest Democrats in Congress, she has been ranked the 8th most-effective legislator in the Democratic Party according to the Center for Effective Lawmaking. She serves as Chair of ASPIRE PAC through which she supports Asian American candidates across the country, and works to ensure that Asian American voices and concerns are heard in the political process.

In February of 2017, Grace was elected Vice Chair of the Democratic National Committee where she focused on winning back the House in 2018 and winning back the White House in 2020.

OUTSTANDING PEGLEG IN SUPPORT OF NYC PUBLIC SCHOOLS



Vishal Garg '95 is the Founder and CEO of Better, the first and only digital-first homeownership company whose goal is to make homes more affordable, more accessible and just plain better, for all Americans and eventually everyone else. To date, under Vishal's leadership, Better.com has provided over \$40BN in home financing and provided over \$16BN in cumulative coverage through Better Cover and Better Settlement Services, the insurance divisions of Better.com. Better.com has raised over \$400M in equity capital and is backed by SoftBank, L Catterton, Kleiner Perkins, Goldman Sachs, Ally Bank, American Express, Citi and other investors.

In addition to his role at Better, he serves as the founding partner of One Zero Capital, an investment holding company focused on creating and investing in businesses within consumer finance, technology, and digital marketing. At 21, Vishal dropped out of the investment banking analyst program at Morgan Stanley and started MyRichUncle, which became the second largest private student lender in the United States. It went public in 2005 and was subsequently acquired by Merrill Lynch.

In 2021, Vishal launched a partnership with the Fund for Public Schools in NYC, donating nearly \$2M to buy Chromebook, iPads, Wi-Fi hotspots, books and uniforms for over 20,000 NYC public school students from low income backgrounds to better cope with at home and online learning during the COVID pandemic.

THE YOUNG PEGLEG



Lindon Gao '09 is the Founder and CEO of Caper AI, the world's first smart grocery cart powered by artificial intelligence. Caper Cart uses AI-powered cameras and weight sensors to recognize items as they are placed into the cart without having to scan or weigh them. Customers can pay with the cart and bypass the checkout lines. In October 2021, Instacart announced that it was acquiring Caper for \$350 million.

Caper might be Lindon's most successful company to date but it is definitely not his first. Lindon already started his first company trading gaming collectables by the time he entered Stuyvesant. By age 19 when he was studying at NYU Stern, he started his second company, LPG Crafts, which he turned into a multi-million dollar business.

Post-college, he worked at Goldman Sachs as an investment banker for more than two years but eventually realized that he preferred entrepreneurship to finance. In 2016, Lindon and his co-founders launched QueueHop, an anti-theft apparel tag that would unlock when you pay with an app. QueueHop was accepted by Y Combinator and even raised \$150K in seed capital. Their work on QueueHop eventually led them to develop Caper. In 2020, Lindon and his Caper co-founders were all named to Forbes' "30 Under 30" list for their transformative product in the Retail & Ecommerce industry.
